3:00 - 4:30	Unconscious Bias: <i>This interactive workshop will examine the role implicit bias plays in different life outcomes (employment, health and well-being, and etc). Implicit bias has come to be recognized as a powerful force that not only shapes individual actions, but institutional policies and practices as well. This session will look at three primary mechanisms that produce bias: priming, associations, and assumptions. This session will also create understanding of actions people can take to counteract negative associations that lead to negative consequences for underrepresented people.
